Beautiful: very attractive:

She was wearing a beautiful dress.



Flower: a plant that is often brightly colored and has a pleasant smell:

Has anyone watered the flowers lately?



Class: The place where students are taught:

I was late so teacher didn't let me enter the class.



Special: not ordinary or usual:

His father designed him a special pencil.



Excited: feeling very happy and enthusiastic:

An excited crowd waited for the singer to arrive.



Impatiently: with annoyance or anxiety at having to wait:

He walked to the room impatiently.



School bell: a bell rung to announce beginning or ending of class:

The school bell goes at three every afternoon.



Nature: the physical world and living things in their natural state; all things that are not made by people:

A camping trip is a good way to experience nature.



Enjoy: to get pleasure from something:

I really enjoyed that movie.



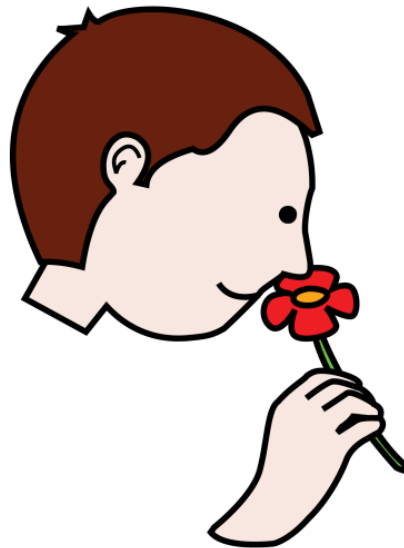
Colorful: having a bright color or a lot of different colors:

a colorful blue and yellow dress



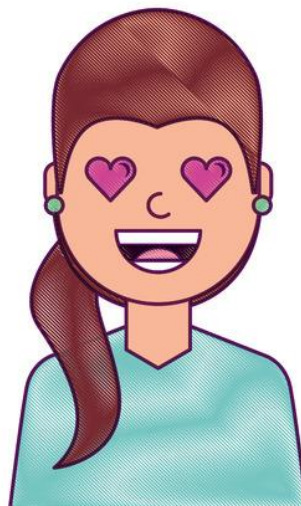
Smell: to sense the odor of by means of the nose:

My hands smell of onions.



Delightful: very pleasant, attractive, or enjoyable:

Our new neighbours are delightful.



Magnificent: very good, beautiful, or deserving to be admired:

They live in a magnificent Tudor house.



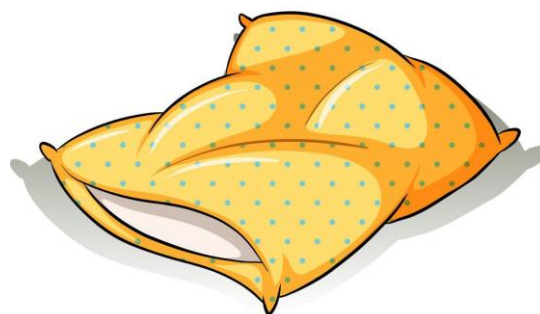
Vivid: very brightly colored:

She was wearing a vivid pink shirt.



Pillow: a soft pad filled with stuffing and used for resting the head on while sleeping:

Do you prefer a feather pillow or a foam pillow?



Eventually: at a future time; in the end; finally:

Cut flowers will eventually die.



Grass: a green plant with narrow pointed leaves:

He sat on the grass, strumming his guitar.



Tree: a tall plant that has a wooden branches with leaves and fruits:

You can hang your coat on the clothes tree.



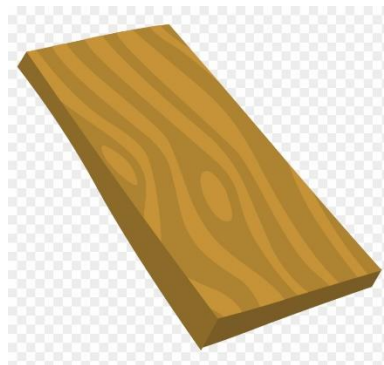
Bring: to take or carry someone or something to a place or a person, or in the direction of the person speaking:

Can you help me bring in the bags ?



Texture: the feel or look of a surface:

The wood had a rough texture.



Seed: the small part of a flowering plant that grows into a new plant:

The farmers grow these crops for seed.



Immortal: living or lasting forever:

In that story, all the vampires were immortal.



Beauty: the quality of being pleasant to the senses or beautiful:

The beauty of the music delighted us.



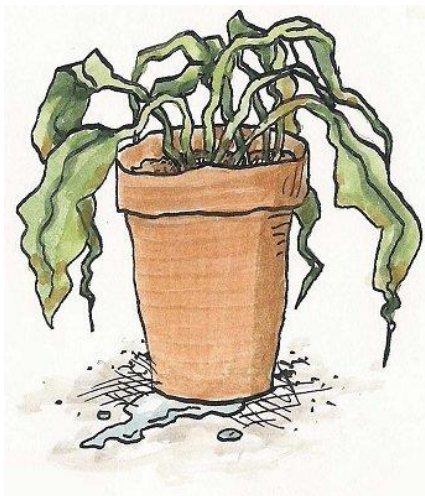
Speech: the ability to talk, the activity of talking, or a piece of spoken language:

Children usually develop speech in the second year of life.



Withered: dry and decaying:

The flowers in the garden withered from lack of rain.



Day by day: on each successive day; gradually and steadily:

Day by day I grew worse.



Rotten: decayed:

The room smelled of rotten vegetables.



Decide: to choose something, especially after thinking carefully about several possibilities:

They have to decide by next Friday.



Explain: to make clear in speech or writing; show in detail:

The teacher explained the rules to the children.



Pluck: to grab with the fingers and pull off; pick:

She plucked an apple from the tree.



Harm: injury or hurt:

Thankfully no one was harmed in the accident.



Maintain: to continue; keep in existence:

The children of the neighborhood maintained their friendships for many years.



Protect: to keep someone or something safe from injury, damage, or loss:

Patients' names have been changed to protect their privacy.



Plant: a living thing that grows in earth, in water:

Water the plants everyday.



Animal: something that lives and moves but is not a human, bird, fish, or insect:

Some animals hunt at night.
