Migratory: relating to birds, fish, or animals that migrate:

The stork is a migratory bird.



Migrate: to move from one place into another:

Their grandparents migrated from Aydın to Mardin.



Once upon a time: at some time in the past (used as a conventional opening of a story):

"Once upon a time she would have been jealous, but no longer"



Town: small city:

We stayed in the best hotel in town.



Circle: a round, flat shape like the letter O, or a group of people or things arranged in this shape

Colored paper was cut into circles.



Folk: people:

Ordinary folk can't afford cars like that.



Village: a small town or community, often in the country:

The whole village is against the plan for a new highway..



Triangle: a flat shape with three sides:

Which earrings did you buy in the end - the triangles or the circles?



Roll around: (of a time or event) to happen:

by the time Ramadan rolls around.



Lucky: having good things happen to you by chance:

The lucky winner will be able to choose from three different holidays.



Surprised: shocked or amazed by something unexpected:

We were very surprised at the result.



Unhappy: sad or not satisfied:

I was very unhappy with the service.



Cheer: glad feelings; happiness:

Everyone cheered as the winners received their medals.



Happily: in a happy way:

He was happily married with two young children.



Huge: extremely large in size or amount:

They live in a huge house.



Side by side: (of two or more people or things) close together and facing the same way: "The two institutions worked side by side in complete harmony"



Judging: to hear and decide:

The court judged the case in our favor.



Unique: being the only one of its type; sole; single:

Everyone's fingerprints are unique.



Talents: a natural skill or ability:

He has a talent for acting, so he will be the star of the play.



Origins: the beginning or cause of something:

Her unhappy childhood was the origin of her problems later in life.
