Pre-Reading Activity 1	5 Minutes	Individual	The student will be showed the drawing (appendix 1) about the story. Teacher asks "If you were going to be a shape, which would you like to be? Why?" Pre-Reading Activity 2	5 Minutes	Individual	Teacher gives the worksheet to the students. (appendix 2). Students match the vocabulary with their definitions.	As a solution for the students who don't have enough vocabulary knowledge.	Writing	Story Book Worksheet
While-Reading Activity 1	10 Minutes	Individual	Teacher gives the short story to the students. T wants them to read the story silently and gives 10 minutes for this.	To understand the story with details.	Reading	Worksheet

While-Reading Activity 2	5 Minutes	Group work	"Judging people before you know them can make you miss their unique talents that comes from their origins." T asks them "What do you understand from this quote? Do you agree with this idea? If so, why? Teacher gives feedback to the students.	Provide students to think about the quote.	Speaking	Worksheet
Post-Reading Activity 1	10 Minutes	Groupwork	Teacher divides students into groups. Students will be divided into three groups and each group has some circles and triangles. Students act out the dialogues from the story.	To make students empathize with characters.	Speaking	Short Story

Post-Reading Activity 2	5 Minutes	Individual	The students will be asked the questions: "Which character do you associate more with yourself? What is the reason for that?" "Which features do you have in common?"	To improve their speaking skills. To enhance their comments about the story.	Speaking	-
